Westford Hill Distillers Poiré Prissonnier • A pear brandy with punch (nothing sweet here).	Dogfish Head Brown Honey Rum • Yes, beer nerd, they make hooch, like this chewy rum.	Siesta Key Spiced Rum • Aromatic; use in umbrella drinks.	13th Colony Southern Rye • Dry and spicy whiskey, with a classic rye bite.	Ocean Vodka • Smooth, like a surfboard slicing a wave at Hanalei Bay.	Blue Ice Vodka • Salty, squeaky clean and wonderfully neutral.	FEW Spirits American Gin • A tringe of citrus, introduce her to Tom Collins.	Joss Vodka • Made from Nebraska wheat, it's sweet yet earthy.	Josiah Bartlett Barrel Aged Apple Brandy • Fruity and rich, akin to French Calvados.	Busted Barrel Silver Rum • Made from molasses, it's brash and spicy.	Don Quixote Blue Corn Bourbon • Seriously smoky. Sips more like mescal than Maker's Mark.	Hudson Baby Bourbon Whiskey • Sweet caramel corn on the lips, silky on the swallow.	TOPO Vodka • Featherweight mouthfeel, with hints of coconut.	Maple River Rhubarb Vodka • Bright, tart, sassy. Perfect for summer punches.	Las Vegas Distillery Nevada Vodka • Starts with a sting, closes with a rounded mouthfeel.	OYO Wheat Whiskey • Dry, with cherry and nut tones. Try in a Manhattan.	Prairie Wolf Vodka • Bold and grassy, meet your new Bloody Mary vodka.	Glaser Distillery Limoncello • Cloudy in the bottle, sweet lemon custard on the tongue.	Dad's Hat Pennsylvania Rye • A traditional P-A rye, it boasts funky honey and banana notes.
Heartland Distillers Sorghum • Rum-like and hearty, with a hint of maple.	Cedar Ridge Apple Brandy • Fruity and full-bodied. Fill your flask with it.	Clear10 Vodka • Neutral, with a stiff citrus zing.	Michler's US #1 Small Batch Bourbon • Rich, spicy with soft vanilla flavors.	Old New Orleans Cajun Spice Rum • Nutmeg, clove and cayenne. Xmas drinks just got hot.	New England Distilling Ingenuum Gin • Complex, structured and strongly herbal.	Sloop Betty Vodka • Liquid cashmere. Try ice cold, neat. Bonus: it's kosher.	Berkshire Mountain Greylock Gin • Dry, with huge juniper, conaneder and anise.	New Holland Brewing's Hatter Royale Hopquila • A hop-based booze, flush with floral notes.	Prairie Organic Vodka • Full-bodied, and crisp as a Northern Minnesota lake.	360 Vodka • Eco-friendly, right down to the reusable swing-top bottle.	Cathared Pecan Vodka • Nutty, rich, a natural for cool-weather cocktails.	Whistling Andy Hibiscus-Coconut Rum • Like drinking in the scents of a beach.	Thomas Tew Single Barrel Rum • Amber, gently spiced and mellow.	Striped Shine • It's 120-proof, but drinks easy, with Corn Pops cereal notes.	Bickering Brothers Brandy • Butterscotch and hints of oak. Nuanced enough to drink neat.	Pritchard's Private Stock Rum • Weighty, rich and toffee-like, it's rum with gravitas.	Balcoves Brimstone Corn Whiskey • Super-smoky, BBQ-worthy. A booze-industry fave.	High West Son of Bourne Whiskey • Full-bodied, with lots of caramel and spice.	Berr Hill Gin • Made with raw honey, it's robust but pleasantly sweet.	Wasmond's Single Malt Whiskey • A single-malt American beauty. No kilt required.	Oola Waitsburg Bourbon Whiskey • Hazelnut aroma, with a dry and spicy palate.	Death's Door Gin • Crisp, clean, classic—an ideal martini gin.	Smooth Ambler Greenbrier Gin • Floral and light, with a honey-sweet finish.	Wyoming Whiskey • Sour and bosque, in a good way. Should come with a cowboy hat.
